

Inclement Weather Policy

In case of weekday inclement weather situations, it is the policy of the Church of the Good Shepherd to follow the lead of NOVA Community College (Annandale Campus) for delayed opening and campus closings. In the case of weekend inclement weather, Saturday events will be decided on a case-by-case basis by parish leadership (Rector and Wardens, in consultation with the Buildings and Grounds program manager). Sunday worship will be held but, depending on travel safety, may consist of a single service and/or be offered only online. If all in-person worship services are cancelled, Morning Prayer will be livestreamed at 10:15a either from the Sanctuary or from the Officiant's home. 
