Candlemas - The Feast of the Presentation

This Sunday, February 2

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation, also known as Candlemas, in which 40 days after his birth, the infant Jesus was presented in the Temple and the prophets Simeon and Anna recognized him as the Messiah and the Light to the Nations. Candlemas is one of the oldest feasts of the Christian church, celebrated since the early 4th century, and it became a tradition to bless the church's candles on this day, as well as any candles to be used at home for prayer or devotion.

If you have candles you use for personal prayer and devotion, you are invited to bring them to worship next Sunday to be blessed!
